CONSERVATION MANAGEMENT AT PRETTY CORNER WOODS

The wildlife at Pretty Corner Woods is greatly loved by all. The practical conservation methods and management of the site, carried out by our rangers and volunteers, ensures that a mixture of habitats are created, maintained, and protected for the benefit of the rich diversity of wildlife species that have made these woods their home. On your visit to Pretty Corner Woods you'll discover an interesting range of natural habitats. You will find broadleaf and coniferous trees, heathland, grassland and ponds, as well as veteran trees such as oak, beech and sweet chestnut that date back hundreds of years.

Pretty Corner is home to many common species of flora and fauna, including adders, slow worms, common newts, bats, deer, butterflies, owls and woodpeckers amongst many more.

Please help us look after our wildlife and their homes by keeping to the main waymarked trails & woodland rides and not venturing into woodland blocks. Please do not litter the park, its best to take it home. Please follow the countryside code and help us look after this beautiful site and its wildlife.

Together they stretch along the 10-mile Holt to Cromer ridge within the North Norfolk area of outstanding natural beauty. Located a few miles from the historic market town of Sheringham, Pretty Corner Woods is a great place for families to play, learn, explore and be creative together.
