Look for the fluttering wings of bats, bullfinches, kingfishers, butterflies, buzzards, owls and woodpeckers!


Tread carefully around the woodland flowers and ferns. Look out for the scarlet flowers on the red campion, and the white tips of wood sorrel.

Sssshh! If you're really quiet you might even see a deer munching on the long grass, or spot an adder or slow worm sunning itself in the heathland areas.

## Everyone welcome in Pretty Corner Woods

**This magical wood is very popular with families who enjoy fun-packed, free days out.**

Located a few miles from the historic town of Sheringham, Pretty Corner Wood is the ideal place for the family to play, learn and be creative together. Throughout the wood you will find lots of natural play features, fun trails, ponds, sculpture rubbings and wildlife.

For visitors who enjoy long walks, we recommend a stroll up to the highest point in the wood. At 96 metres (315 feet) above sea level it is one of the highest points in Norfolk. The fine views towards Sheringham and out to the North Sea are worth the effort.

As you explore the wood you'll pass through beautiful woodland, ponds, open heathland and grassland. Look out for the veteran trees such as oak, beech and sweet chestnut that date back hundreds of years.

A secret world lives in Pretty Corner Woods. Pick up a free Pretty Corner Explorer booklet to help you and your family discover just some of the wildlife hiding among the trees.

There are 31 things to spot, from mighty oaks to the smallest kingfishers. Some will be very easy to find; some you can only see at certain times of year. Others only come out at night!
