### CHAPTER 1: DESIGNATION OF CORPUSTY & SAXTHORPE AS A NEIGHBOURHOOD AREA

The article explains that Neighbourhood Areas are formally designated areas within which Neighbourhood Development Plans and Neighbourhood Development Orders can be prepared. It notes that the designation of a Neighbourhood Area enables the Town or Parish Council to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan that can contain local policies or proposals relating to the development of land, and, once adopted, they would become part of the wider statutory Development Plan for North Norfolk.
