

## COUNTRYSIDE SERVICE

The Park is managed by a small team as part of North Norfolk District Council's countryside service. The service is based out of Holt Country Park and also covers fourteen other sites across the district, including two further Green Flag sites at Pretty Corner Woods in Sheringham and Sadlers Wood in North Walsham.

## CONSERVATION MANAGEMENT AT HOLT COUNTRY PARK

The wildlife at Holt Country Park is greatly loved by all. The practical conservation methods and management of the site, carried out by our rangers and volunteers, ensures that a mixture of habitats are created, maintained, and protected for the benefit of the rich diversity of wildlife species that have made the park their home. You may be surprised to know that Great Crested Newts, Smooth Newts, Palmate Newts, Adders, Grass Snakes, Tawny Owls, Buzzards, Soprano pipistrelle bats, Silver washed fritillary and White admiral butterflies, dragonflies and many damselfly species can be discovered within Holt Country Park.

Please help us look after our wildlife and their homes by keeping to the main waymarked trails & woodland rides and not venturing into woodland blocks. Please keep dogs out of the main pond and our specially created amphibian ponds to help protect our little friends. Please do not litter the park, its best to take it home. Please follow the countryside code and help us look after our beautiful country park and its wildlife.

Loved our visit.

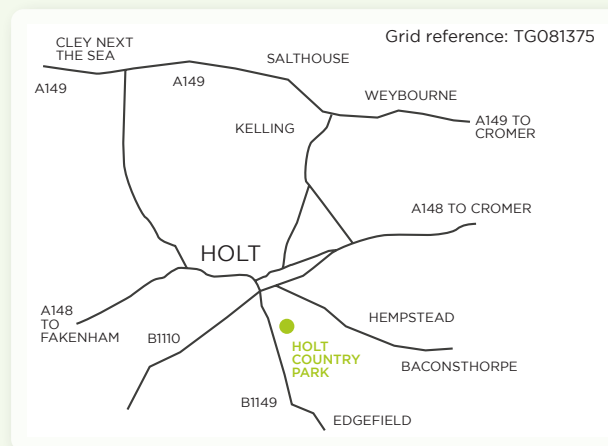

There is no entry charge for Holt Country Park but if you are coming by car there is a small car parking charge of £2.50. This covers you all day and helps us to keep the park looking beautiful for you.

You can pay using cash (no change is available on site), card, or via the Council's parking app - ParkingOps, which is available to download on Google Play and the App Store.

The mobile phone signal in the park is limited, but you can log onto Hetty's House Tea Room's wifi during their opening hours or use the app to pay before you leave for your visit.
